Sermons preached during the absence of the Rev^d Hunter & Remarks.

Sept. 17. O. Upon 20. 16. in John's Tabernacle. Weather bad.

29. Major Cook notified the building Committee to pay their indebtedness to him.

October 1. O. Yegah 40. 11. In Church like a flock in many respects.

Letter a meeting of the church council to consider the demands of Major Cook.

The meeting was held. The papers were called for examined and returned to James Haymire and it was agreed that some payment should be made on the demands of Major Cook so soon as money could be raised on the 20\$ notes. The Rev^d J. Fishburn preached in the afternoon on Rom. 5. 1.

8. A funeral address over the corpse of John Kauper - a german, who died in Williamsburg on the 7th October 1865, buried Friday in our graveyard. He left a widow & children. Lutheran & also a Roman Catholic.

10. at Funeral Service on Amos D. 6/ son James, Franklin Brothers Capelman son of Michael Capelman the wife of Williamsburg, born 12 April 1855 and died 8 October 1865. Buried 10 October 1865 at John's graveyard.

15. Sermon on Mat. 7. 13. The gospel gate of life.

29. Thanksgiving sermon on Col. 3. 15. Few in church - bad weather.

Nov. 7. Dispensed the Lord's supper to Mr^e Mike Capelman, being sick & dying.

11. Funeral Service on 16oz. 15. 55th over Mr^e Elija Capelman, wife of Mike Capelman died Nov 1865 - buried 11 Nov. 1865.

12. O. No service in John's - my eye bags very full. -

28. The Rev^d Hunter returned from his visit to Virginia. See blotter.

Sermons preached during the Interim from October 1867 till July 26th 1868 by the Rev^d H. Hayunga of Williamsburg.

From the time in October 1867 that the Rev^d Hunter left this place till Nov. 24th there were no services in this church, took people said - who asked about this absence of services here, "return home for a while" without services, which indicated to some, as if they supposed the Rev^d Hunter would return to them soon.

1st Nov. 1868. Rev Boyer preached in John's, in the afternoon lots. The day at Mr C. Haymire.

Dec. 1. & An Hayunga preached in Col. 4. 3 at the request of Rev Kahler. Meeting of the church council. Discussed the propriety of calling some a Minister as successor of the Rev^d Hunter. All was indefinite.

Remainder preached during the winter while Rev. Hunter is in Ohio.

1867. Decr. 15. Rom. 12. 2f. What does the Bible reveal. Notes are not taken on this
Rev. Hunt and Bartholomew Miller came to him, whom he writes.

25. 2 msp. Festival on May 9. 6th On the blessing of the Gospel.

- Noted that Rev. Fishburn, will visit the Cong. that Rev. Boyce will

12. 8. M. 2 Cor 5. 17. What he, passing away did that he became new?

17 Notified that Rev. Fishburn will hold a Communion on 17th
and a preparation on 18th instant.

24 Repeated the said by law of the Cong. for by this means we
can do something to keep the notes good every year till
we see further & can do better. See Constitution Book.

18. Rev. Fishburn preached preparation Col. 1. 10^f

The Confession was heard by Rev. Hayunga.

Meeting of the 2 Church councils in the vestry.

Conference was had, & a Union between the 2 Congs effected for one
pastor to serve both Cherokee congregation - that Rev. Fishburn
be the pastor elect, that it be left at his option whether to reside
in the front parsonage or in the rear one, that the front pay him \$300.
a year of firewood & let him have the first premium - for 3 Sundays
in the month the rear pay \$600 - with hay for his horse for 3 months,
in the month he to pay his moving expenses in equal portions.
That he is informed to tell him complete his arrangements -

which may not be sooner than next fall or perhaps sooner.

The 2 Councils agreed to this letter as so stated to the Rev Fishburn verbally, and the meeting was closed. The Rev Haynes was present as Director Secy.

19. Rev Fishburn preached sermon from Mat. H. 28.

of the Holy Sacrament of the Supper of the Lord was dispensed to 70. Comt.

24 Published the union & proceedings of the 2 Councils had on yesterday on the recommendation of the Rev Boyce, who urged such a Union to preserve the congregation, as they do not desire to have him any longer here he is preparing to leave for Ohio.

20. Heard that the first Cong. pronounced the Union illegal proceedings as unconstitutional, that there must be an overhaul of them to nullify them.

22. Wrote a letter to Rev Fishburn of his dissatisfaction of the Comt, that it will be left to a cong. vote in a public meeting soon to be held.

26. No voice - because it was too stormy for me to go out.

Rev Boyce preached in Fifield - his farewell sermon.

Feby. 2. O. Proverbs 4. 23. On the human heart. Harming but mending.

1/ Meeting of the congregation - discussion on the propriety of approving & disapproving the Union, &c. Recalling Rev Hunter as pastor elect.

2/ Postponed action on this point, till next meeting when more members may be present.

3/ M. M. D. Willard read a letter of the Rev Hunter - signifying his willingness to return - if recalled, under certain conditions, &c. to return next spring day in June incoming.

9. O. Gal. 1. 15-17. On the character of St Paul.

1/ A congregational meeting was held. Many present.

2/ There were passed eleven Resolutions, at which the union was repealed. The proceedings of the 2 Councils are nullified - the character of the Rev Fishburn will take care of, & the Rev. Hunter ordered to be recalled &c. [order for a copy of these elsewhere] (page 422.)

16. O. Sermon on 2 Tim. 1. 12. Confidence of St Paul in God.

1/ Church council met. Read the 11 Resolutions. They ordered Haynes to be sent to Fishburn, Hunter, & John B. Mettken. 2/ Wrote to call to Hunter to be issued to be copied by the church council. 4/ Some were absent & ordered that Rev Haynes sign the call for them that are present.

18 Sermons & Remarks during the duration of Rev. Hunter being in this
City, stated that the subscriptions of salary were run on the basis that there shall
be service on Sabbath, if possible, every Sunday forenoon, & every alternate
Sabbath, at Morenciburg, in the afternoon or Evening, if possible, & of a
place be provided for for Mr. Rev. Hunter there to preach. Of course a
slight change as to the hour of meeting is not intended to be made.
If the meeting was closed.

17. Sent Copies of the said 11. Resolutions to the B. persons invited,
but I had previously to them, sent letters of advice to them - stating the main
points of my Resolution in advance, on my own authority.

23. O sermon on May 29. 1844 / from, & ceremonies of Religion will
soon uplift the spirit of piety dwell in them. Very cold & few in.
Council met to approve of the Call. It was approved to be unopposed.

8 March O sermon on Ch 19. 4. The contemplation of the works of God imports, min's
heart of Christians. Noted that nothing has been heard of Mr. Rev. Hunter
the 5th & 6th, has he not thought that the Call had been sent on the 28th Feb -

April 5^o O sermon on Eph. 5. 16. How do we reconcile the two? -
Published that the Rev. J. H. Hunter has accepted the Call. & has
been invited to be here a all June morning & that there
will be service here on the Sabbath of the Month.

- 10 Apr 1868. Good Friday. Luke 23. 43. On the deck of the steamer to the Hudson.
- The Rev. Fishburn at Pekin's again for a week or so.
- 12 Apr 1868. Easter Sunday. 2 Tim. 28. Comfort & joy of believers at the Resurrection off the Fujin - bad Roads - Rainy weather & cold & windy.
- 19 Apr 1868. O sermon on Matt. 6. 28. a providence refuting 2 objections against it.
- Fair attendance. dry road but windy. During the past week I visited the sick of the congregation, being, at present, 3 persons.
- 25 May 1868. O sermon on Col. 4. 16. on reasons to value the holy scripture & 2. objections against them.
- Monthly collection, cleaning the church, Sunday School establishment &c were notified. Meeting of Church Council. It was ordered that \$2. be paid to Mr. W. Mayengen by the treasurer, for portages due him, expended for this congregation in correspondence with Rev. Heaton, & Reotherts by him during the past winter -
- 2/ that \$2. be paid Mr. Brown for cleaning the church during the present week -
- 3/ that the balance in treasury be paid to Mr. J. W. Cook - on the Hill note, is reduction of said indebtedness by the treasurer for the Cong. as soon as possible - say \$16 -
- 4/ that the graveyard fence S. be made as soon as possible.
- 5/ that Mr. D. Willard & Mr. H. Swartfeger be a Committee to arrange matters finally, with those who have advanced \$25. on the \$25 notes on the strength of the Shart notes so soon as the balance of the Shart note comes in hand, and report to the Council.
- 17 May 1868. O sermon on 2 Kings 5. 14. Analogy between leprosy & sin; take reflections thereon.
- Notified that Sunday School should be re-established by next Sunday, that know would be S. V. here on Sunday, day - & that Rev. Heaton could not come till about the end of June. That Pekin has written for a temporary pastor to while he stays there. No reply has yet been received. Very dry for the comfort of the church, wind & about Rain.
- Baptized Florence Louise Mayengen on the 17 May 1868 as daughter of Mr. H. Mayengen & his wife O. T. W. Mayengen, born 15th Apr 1868, at Wethers.
- 21 May 1868. Thursday. Afternoon. Sermon on Eph. 4. 10. On the deplorable effect of the absence of humility, meekness in the holy Catholic Church in the world. See in Rainey's book.
- 27 May 1868. Wednesday. Funeral of Dr. W. A. Palmer in Pekin. on Rev. 26. 4. Eternal life.
- 31 May 1868. O sermon on John 16. 8-11. On the spirit's influence.
- Established again the Sunday School & Bible class, & I attend it till Dec. part time.
- 24 June addressed to the Sunday School teacher & Superintendent. It is well stated, the origin, the design & method of teaching this kind of Schools, its claims in the attention of parents & the church & the proper method of praying in it by Superintendent.

1/ States that the membership will be called upon to defray expenses of pants
oil for the Parsonage Kitchen. 2/ that some remuneration is due to Mr.
Deacon Mc Martin for his efforts to find a person to run the graveyard gate
fencing, having worked faithfully on the premises about 1 whole week unpaid.
3/ that Mr. Hunter be received of the Rev. Hunter, stating that he will return
P. D. either on the 2^d or 3^d. Sunday of July next.
4/ Should he be detained the services will be filled by W. H.
5/ that Huf, who have furnished boards - posts etc for the improvement of
the Hough & graveyard - will please accept the thanks of the Cong. for their
liberality & in hope that Providence may reward them therefore. —
- O. Sermon on 1 Cor. 4. 11 / The divine only foundation of human Salvation.
1/ Announced that Rev. Hunter may be here about the middle of this month.
That a committee of reception be appointed for him this family, and that

in this Church & not to urge him to work forthwith, but to give him
time to rest & recruit from the fatigues of travel & to pray for him
this safe arrival further.

The graveyard fences up to Sunday be accepted.

Resolved that Mr. Mc Martin be paid \$5. for work done and furnishings in said jobs in the parsonage and graveyard.

Resolved that the \$5 be paid Mr. Mc Martin out of the Church funds at present in the hands of Mr. M. Willard, who shall call therefor.

Resolved that a Committee of Reception be appointed for the Revd. Martin - that Mr. S. Stasy be said Committee.

Resolved, that the Revd. H. Haugunga be a committee to make the address of welcome to the Revd. Martin at some suitable time in the Church.

Resolved, that the Revd. Tarkburn be invited to give the friends a sermon, while he is in this County, at a time most suitable to him - to inform Revd. Haugunga thereof to announce it. On a Sunday forenoon or afternoon would be preferable ~~thereon~~ ^{on} another day now.

12th July 1863. A sermon on Rev 3. 23 / Behave the property of it.

Noted that letter has been received that Revd. Slichter cannot come out to preach, for this Cong. because of prior engagement. in the Rear. He is grateful for the honour intended to appreciate it. If the members, who have furnished things - staff & labor for the grave & fence of parsonage are kindly requested to accept the thanks of the Cong. for their liberality, in hope that Providence may reward them therefor.

19th July 1863. A sermon on John 15. 9. special signs by which we show that we continue to love ff.

Noted, that Revd. Martin wishes to be here, as next Sabbath that service would be at the usual hour A.M. that I have now provided already 12 times to this congregation, that the friends of our cause, who have forgiven the debts of the \$25. notes - will please accept the thanks of the Cong. for their liberality to the Church; that the Trustees should continue to manage the Church debts, & yearly make a statement of the balance sheet, so that the Cong. may know how we stand in regard to these debts, that means must be adopted to lessen them as soon as possible; that this day a Church Council is called for, after service, in the vestry. Council met in the vestry room. -

Complaints were made that Mr. Mark Murphy occupies the cellar of the parsonage, that he should be ordered to abstain from doing it. Resolved, that Mr. Mark Murphy, be ordered to leave the cellar apportioned to the Church by Mr. H. Augustus, until the matter is all cleared. -

Sermons preached during Interim No. 4. in 1868.

July 26. O. Sermon on 1 Cor. 15. 58 On terms of salvation for posterity.

1/ Noted that the Revd. J. H. Hunter has arrived safely & the Rev. now at Mr. John R. Copeman's of this place & his family is there also enjoying his hospitality; that next Sunday the Revd. Hunter will preach in P'th's at the usual hour in the forenoon; that I now return into obscurity again; that the Revd. W. Hart's obligation has been paid to the like proceeds of it having applied by the Trustees to liquidate the debts of the Church in as far as such proceeds went for such purpose; that I have given the Cong. all the aid & comfort I could during this interim & that hardly any recognition of the same has ever been made by them; that I now return from the attendance of the Bible class in the Sunday School as the pastor may attend, the attendance being rather too numerous for me now.

2/ Holy Baptism was dispensed by the Revd. Hunter.

3/ The address of welcome was pronounced by the Revd. H. Hayunza to the Revd. J. H. Hunter before the service began, to which the Revd. Hunter made an appropriate response.

4/ The Revd. Hunter invited the Cong. to vote thanks to the Revd. Hayunza for his aid & comfort rendered this long - during this interim, to which vote was signified by rising from their seats - looked, was so done accordingly.

5/ This Interim has lasted about nine months from October 1867 till July 1868. - Revd. Hayunza preached 26 times in fast time.

6/ Revd. Hunter stated privately that he would assume the pastoral office about the 1st of August 1868.
